On November 11, 2006 at the San Luis Obispo Kennel Club Show, Max was awarded his 33rd All-Breed Best In Show by Peggy Beisel-McIlwaine. Peggy awarded Max his very first Best In Show at the Beverly Hills Kennel Club Show in June, 2005. The following day Max took his 34th BIS under Judge R. William Taylor. Max also has five Terrier Specialty Best In Shows. With these wins, Max became the top-winning Airedale in the US. Max was shown 5 times in 2005 for his championship (Great Western) and then again at Montgomery. In the process he took two BIS. This year he's been shown 10 months as a special. Max is currently ranked #3 Terrier and #5 Dog, All Breeds.

His daughter, Ch. Huntwood's Waltzing Mathilda, bred by Susan Kipp and Derek Glas, is currently #3 Airedale in Group points.
